GSC To Begin New Fiscal Year July 10th

The Geauga Safety Council (GSC) is committed to providing quality meetings and special events to its membership. To continue to offer meaningful educational programs, GSC will hold 10 regular meetings (instead of 12) with two special events. The Geauga Safety Council looks forward to working with its current members as well as new enrollees as the fiscal year (FY10) begins. The first meeting of FY10 will be held July 10th (the second Friday of July) in the party room at Fowler’s Mill Golf.

BWC has made one change to the safety council program for FY10. For the 2009 policy year (fiscal year FY10), only non-group employers will be eligible for receiving up to a four-percent premium rebate. As with 2008 (fiscal year FY09), qualifying businesses can earn a two percent rebate for active participation and an additional two percent for meeting certain performance goals.

No other changes have been made. There is NO membership fee. Cost of the luncheon/meeting will NOT increase (unless GSC costs increase). The costs for sponsoring a meeting or placing an ad in the newsletter or awards program will NOT change.

The first semi-annual report is due after June 30th and prior to July 15th. This report is for the six month period from January 1 through June 30, 2009. Figures should be taken from Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 300 report and payroll reports. Holiday and vacation hours should NOT be reported. Accident statistics are used for the purpose of determining eligibility for safety awards and are NOT reported to OSHA or any other enforcement agency.
